



Tell me about bowel screening

- Screening can help prevent bowel cancer, or find it at an early stage when it is easier to treat.
- Bowel cancer screening is done at home.
 You get sent a home test kit to collect a small sample of poo and send it to a lab.
- The test checks for tiny amounts of blood, which you may not be able to see.
- If the test finds anything abnormal, you may be asked to go to hospital to have further tests to confirm or rule out cancer.
- It is simple and easy to do.



If you're worried about your screening, here's some things which may help...

- Ask someone you trust to help you if needed.
- Pick a day to do the screening to help you remember.
- Don't be afraid to ask your healthcare worker questions, such as your GP.
